About Forest Stewardship Plans...

The Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation's **Forest Stewardship Program** supports you in your desire to practice long-term guardianship of your woodlands.

Working on a ten-year management plan with a Massachusetts Licensed Forester offers an excellent opportunity to learn more about your woodland. A Forester considers multiple aspects of forest resource management, including soil and water quality and the way your woodland fits into the larger landscape surrounding it.

The process of creating your Forest Stewardship Plan helps you identify the resources and opportunities available on your property and determine your management goals which *may* include—for example—wildlife habitat improvement, creation of hiking trails or vistas, and generating firewood, timber, or other products. *Harvesting wood products is not a program requirement, though it may be an important means to achieve your stated objectives.* Your Forest Stewardship Plan will contain a property map, individual forest stand information, a description of your management goals, and recommended managing practices designed to bring you closer to achieving your goals. Implementing your ten-year Plan will help maintain your woodland in a healthy, productive condition for present and future owners, and increase the environmental and economic value of your land.

The primary objective of the Forest Stewardship Program is to reduce the likelihood of development of forest properties by encouraging active forest management.

Reimbursement Information:

Who is eligible?

- Landowners owning woodlands of 10 acres or more (7 of which must be wooded with remaining acres being classified as "eligible"), that are not currently enrolled in Forest Stewardship or Chapter 61, 61A or 61B programs.
- Landowners currently enrolled in Chapter 61A or 61B that <u>do not</u> have a forest management/stewardship plan are eligible to receive reimbursement. Eligible private landowners include individuals, trusts, land trusts, clubs, LLC's, associations, and corporate entities.
- Municipally-owned forest land parcels of 25 acres or more are also eligible. Leaseholders are eligible as well.

Forest Stewardship Cost-Share Reimbursement is only for new management plans. Re-certifications and amendments to existing plans (Chapter 61, Tree Farm, etc.) are not eligible to receive reimbursement. *The exception to this rule is the case of a new landowner who inherits a plan from the previous owner. The reimbursement application must be approved by DCR before work on the plan begins.

Cost-Share Reimbursement rates:

10 to 36 acres = \$910

37 to 499 acres = \$910 + \$13.00/acre over 36 acres

Over 500 acres = based on a written estimate by MA Licensed Forester & approved by DCR

Foresters for the Birds—A Woodland Owner Program Focused on Supporting Songbird Habitat

This new program is intended to support landowners with woods who would like to learn more about the bird habitat on their land and how to enhance it in conjunction with other forest management goals. A Massachusetts Licensed Consulting Forester certified in conducting Bird Habitat Assessments will assess your woods for existing and potential bird habitat. The Bird Habitat Assessment will be integrated into your efforts towards other goals such as improving forest health, generating income, or enhancing recreational trails. These recommendations will then be incorporated into your Forest Stewardship Plan.

Reimbursement Information:

Who is eligible?

- Private Landowners with 10 or more wooded acres that <u>are</u> currently enrolled in the Forest Stewardship Program or apply for a Forest Stewardship Plan at the same time.
- Bird Habitat Assessment cost-share assistance is limited to the following Northern Hardwood focus area towns: Ashfield, Buckland, Charlemont, Colrain, Conway, Hawley, Heath, Monroe, Rowe, Shelburne in Franklin County; Chesterfield, Cummington, Goshen, Plainfield, Williamsburg, Worthington in Hampshire County; Adams, Clarksburg, Florida, Hinsdale, North Adams, Peru, Savoy, Williamstown, Windsor in Berkshire County.

Cost-Share Reimbursement rates:

10 to 20 acres = \$300 21 to 50 acres = \$400 50 acres and over = \$500

Reimbursement payments are considered reportable by the IRS and must be reported on your income tax returns. You will receive an IRS Form 1099 for this payment.

The approval notice will specify a reimbursement amount based upon the stated "acreage to be covered by plan" on your application. The reimbursement amount you receive will not exceed the value as determined by the rate formula. The formula we use allows our program to make a firm commitment to you (and many others), yet stay within our allotted budget. It is not meant to suggest what a good Stewardship Plan should cost in your particular case – there are too many variables at play. Many factors affect the cost of a plan: access to the parcel, terrain, variety of habitats and forest cover types, availability of maps, surveys and other documents, presence of good boundary indicators, and the complexity of your goals for the land you love. Consultants' fees also vary. Take the time you need to find a professional you feel comfortable working with and who understands your needs. Please contact the Forest Stewardship Office within 30 days of application submission if you (applicant) determine information on the application to be incorrect.
