Pulpwood and fuelwood are reported in \$ per cord, biomass in \$ per ton. The *Range* shows the high and low prices reported. Half of the prices reported are below the *Median*; half are above. Reporting is voluntary, and this is not a complete record of sale activity in the southern New England region. A **total of 93 timber sales was reported for the SECOND quarter of 1995**.
